
WHAT IS NEPA AND WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

- > The National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969 was created to ensure federal agencies take into consideration environmental actions and decisions for projects that are:
 - » Located on Federal lands;
 - » Federally-funded;
 - » Require federal authorization (such as a permit or license)

> NEPA resulted from several significant environmental disasters











WHAT IS NEPA AND WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?



- > Full disclosure of project impacts
- > Decision making tool
- > Avoids unintended consequences
- > Provides opportunity for public input



WHAT IS NEPA AND WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

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NEPA

NEPA PROCESS – CLASSES OF ACTION

- Categorical Exclusion (CAT EX):
 » Insignificant effect on the environment
- > Environmental Assessment (EA):
 - » Impacts not clear, evaluates alternatives
- Environmental Impact Statement (EIS):
 - » Detailed analysis
- > Supporting Analysis
 - » Feasibility Studies
 - » Environmental Information Volumes
 - » Field Studies
 - » ..and more

- Principles of NEPA Decision Making
 - » Alternatives analysis
 - » Impact assessment
 - » Impact mitigation
 - » Interagency coordination
 - » Public involvement
 - » Documentation
- > Plan ahead! Timelines vary by class of action.



DEVELOPMENT OF ANALYSIS

Project Description and Purpose and Need Statement

> Alternatives Development

- » No action
- » Action(s) including preferred
- » History & methodology
- » Alternatives not being carried forward

> Affected Environment

- » Baseline Conditions
- » Best Available Data
 - Existing documents/studies
 - Field Inventory
 - Agency information
 - In-house knowledge

> Environmental Consequences

- » Impact Analysis
 - Direct
 - Indirect
 - Cumulative
- » Mitigation
 - Avoid
 - Minimize
 - Rectify
 - Reduce/Eliminate over time
 - Compensate



> Draft NEPA document

- » Public meeting
- » Public and agency review

> Final NEPA document

- » Find of No Significant Impacts (FONSI)
- » Record of Decision (ROD)





CHALLENGES AND KEYS TO SUCCESS

> Challenges

- » Seasonality of field surveys/locations
- » Coordination with Federal, state, local, and Tribal
- » Opposition to the project
- » Timelines for approval
- » Policy changes


> Keys to Success

- » Communication early and often!
- » Clear project description/ purpose and need statement
- » Hire a third party NEPA consultant
- » Plan ahead
