San Juan College School Of Energy History

San Juan College School Of Energy Founded 2003, beginning in a 10,000 ft facility.

In 2015, a 66,000 square foot facility became permanent facility on the north end of the campus.

It is one of only a few similar programs in the country, and has attracted industry interest from the region, nation, and overseas.

The school has a <u>90 percent graduation rate</u>, and <u>80 percent of graduates get placed in jobs as</u> they leave the college.

Partnerships with University of New Mexico, New Mexico State, New Mexico Tech, Sandia National Labs and Los Alamos National Lab have strengthened the institutions reputation as a recognized community college of excellence

The partnership with New Mexico Tech and San Juan College is very unique.

San Juan College graduates can apply their two year associates toward a four year undergraduate degree, and in turn, petroleum engineering and geology students at New Mexico Tech are able to access hands on training at the San Juan College School Of Energy for professional development.

The School of Energy trains about 7,000 people annually in various industry related areas, not only from the San Juan Basin, but from the DJ/Powder River, Permian and Eagle ford Shale basins of the United States.

Our Industrial Safety Department trains over 6000 people annually both at the School of Energy and off site in New Mexico, Arizona, Colorado and Utah in PEC Safeland, HAZWOPER, FA-CPR-AED-BBP and MSHA and other safety metrics requested by industry.

Part of the Industrial Safety Department is to also reach out to our indigenous communities, in which we have recently trained over 65 people at various Navajo Nation Chapter Houses in New Mexico and Arizona in CPR-FA-BBP and AED.



Metallica's foundation, All Within My Hands (AWMH), continues its multimillion-dollar investment in critical workforce programs at community colleges nationwide.

Among the schools, San Juan College (SJC) returns as a Metallica Scholars Institution for a second year and will continue to receive funding from the Metallica Scholars Initiative (MSI) to enhance career and technical education programs.

What began with 10 colleges and mostly manufacturing programs has developed into a diverse offering of workforce opportunities for students interested in gaining the skills and training necessary to find meaningful and well-paying careers. At SJC, students can use Metallica Scholars funding to help pay for training in the following fields:

•<u>Automotive Technology</u> •<u>Building Trades & Construction</u> •<u>Diesel Technology</u> •<u>Industrial Maintenance Tech</u> •<u>Mechanical Design</u> •Welding

In addition, funds can be used to provide supportive services such as counseling, food insecurity, transportation and childcare. Up to 80 San Juan College students will benefit directly this academic year with scholarships from the MSI grant.
